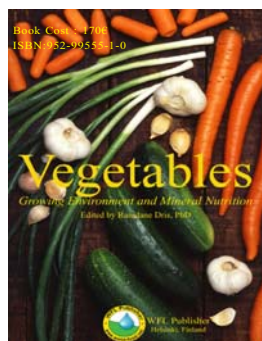
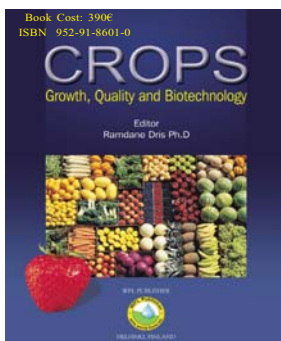

INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

The International Journal of Food, Agriculture & Environment publishes commentary, peer-reviewed original research, critical reviews, and/or short communications in agriculture and food science, with particular emphasis on interdisciplinary studies on the food, agricultural and environmental interface. This journal also considers a limited number of relevant scholarly manuscripts addressing ethical and socioeconomic issues related to modern agricultural and environmental sciences, and articles on current issues of general interest. The Journal offers advertisement space for special announcements from, and employment opportunities.

SUBMISSION OF PAPERS

Kindly send us by email a short abstract of your manuscript. If your manuscript fits the scope of our journal, thus we will invite to send your manuscript to two external reviewers. Once reviewed and improved, you may send via email (MS Word) your manuscript. However, if we face some difficulties to read your manuscript, we kindly invite you to submit an electronic version saved in a CD in a format compatible with MS Word. Please include all tables or photos inside the body of the text and **double check the English of your text, symbols, graphs or equations or formula (Please mention any special fonts used in the manuscript)**. We will request you to send two copies of the manuscript including original prints of photos or graphs.

Please note that you must send your manuscript to at least two external reviewers before you submit it to our journal. The full name and address including emails of the two reviewers must be mentioned on the letter.

Please note that inadequately or incorrectly prepared manuscript will be rejected. The English of the manuscript must be checked by at least two English scientists or language specialists. However, we might assist some scientists in language check against payment. Authors will receive an acknowledgment of receipt of their paper followed, normally within less than 3 months, by a decision. Only accepted manuscripts will be published within a short period of time. The estimated period varies between 2 and 5 months.

While preparing a manuscript, authors should refer to a recent issue of print or online version of the Journal or visit www.isfae.org

The manuscript should be accompanied by a letter of transmittal (sent by air mail), in which the author may specify the name of reviewers who have reviewed the manuscript plus three to more potential referees including their complete addresses, phone and fax numbers, e-mail addresses, and areas of expertise.

The corresponding author must obtain the consent of all the co-authors for the submission of the manuscript. Manuscripts will only be accepted on the understanding that the contents have neither been published nor are being considered for publication elsewhere. The accepted manuscript or other contributions will be published in the Print and/or Online versions of the Journal. When the manuscript is accepted for publication, the Author will be asked to assign full copyright.

MANUSCRIPT PREPARATION

Manuscript length should not normally exceed 25 pages, 1.5 space, 12 fonts, including all relevant materials. The hard copy of the manuscript should be typed on one side of A4 or 8½" × 11" paper with 3 cm margin on left, right, top and bottom. Underlining to indicate italicised type (or use of italic) should be restricted to general and species names, chemical descriptors (e.g. *cis*, *trans* etc) and journal and book titles. Footnotes should be kept to a minimum and indicated by * or †. Do not use full stops after abbreviations unless essential for clarity. Abbreviations of chemical and other names should be defined when first mentioned in the paper, unless commonly used and internationally known and accepted. Use SI units in accord with the recommendations of the International Organisation for Standardisation (ISO). Use the form g kg⁻¹ etc (not %) to specify composition/concentration. Avoid the use of g per 100 g, for example in food/feed composition; instead use g kg⁻¹. Fertiliser rates should be presented in terms of the element applied. Unusual symbols (including Greek letters) should be defined in words in the left margin at the first mention. Give the scientific names (with authority) for plants, animals and microorganisms with generic names in full at the first mention, e.g. *Myzus persicae* (Sulzer), thereafter, abbreviate them in the text, e.g. *M persicae*. Identify each enzyme together with its EC number, if available, at the first mention by following the latest edition of *Enzyme Nomenclature*, and use the current systematic IUPAC nomenclature throughout.

Title should be bold and 14 fonts (e.g. **Agricultural products...**). Following 2 line space, the author (s) full name(s) (starting with name then family name, 11 fonts, bold), then give full address(es) and include Tel/fax/email address (if available) of the corresponding author, *in Italics*. The main body of the paper should be divided into unnumbered sections (e.g. Abstract, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results and Discussion, Conclusions, Acknowledgements and References) and centred over the text, and should have one line space above it. Abstract must be informative yet concise and should not exceed 300 words. List no more than ten *Key words*. Check References (superscripts) carefully for accuracy and style. Refer to unpublished work only in the text (e.g. William, M. N., unpublished; Brown, C. D. pers. comm.). Cite references at the appropriate place in the text using superscript numbers in the order they appear, and a full numerical list must appear in References section, giving all authors with initials after their respective surname. Abbreviate all journal titles as in *Chemical Abstracts* or *Biological Abstracts* and the annual *BIOSIS List of Serials*, using full stops after abbreviation, and bold the volume numbers. If the journal is not included, give its title in full.

All tables, figures (*drawings and photographs*) should be referred in the appropriate section of the text and their positions should be indicated in the margin. Each table should have a concise self-explanatory title, and abbreviations used should be defined immediately below the table. Figures should be large enough to allow a potential 33% reduction in size, and alphabetical or numerical characters should be at least 1.5 mm high in print. All legends to figures should be printed on the same sheet of each figure. Photographs if are used, should be of good contrast and printed on glossy paper.
